

EDUCATION ENRICHMENT SCHOLARSHIPS For Students

Application quarterly deadline: October 1st, January 1st, April 1st, July 1st

After completing the scholarship profile, applicants will complete one online application for all enrichment scholarships instead of a separate application for each scholarship. *Please provide a recommendation letter from a teacher/educator in the field related to your request.* For example, a recommendation letter from a music teacher would be appropriate for a music camp scholarship application. Recipients may still be awarded from more than one scholarship fund, should the committee choose to do so, based upon criteria and available funds. Awards will not typically exceed \$500.

- The Don and Ruth Chadderdon Music Scholarship was established for Marshall High School instrumental music students, during high school or after graduation, or previous recipients seeking a career in teaching or performance or for music camps, seminars or summer programs in instrumental music.
- ❖ The Phillip R. Clissold Vocal Music Scholarship provides awards to Marshall Public School choir students (Grade 7-11) wishing to attend a Summer Vocal Music Camp/Seminar. Recipients are required to continue in the vocal music program in good standing for 12 months after being awarded. Western Michigan University or Wolverine Camps are preferred but others will be considered. The amount of the award will vary.
- The Karissa "Kari" Hamaker Performing Arts Scholarship is awarded to a student in Marshall, Olivet or the surrounding area, during school or upon graduation, seeking a degree in Performing Arts or for additional enrichment opportunities in performing art. April 1 deadline only.
- The Tom and Lucy Franke Education Enrichment Scholarship was established for Marshall Public Schools students seeking educational enrichment opportunities, such as, but not limited to: Weekend seminars; Fine Arts, Math or Science Camps or similar enrichment opportunities; Regional, National or International travel for educational purposes.
- The Success Fund for Marshall Public Schools Scholarship was established for students seeking assistance with non-school related programs and experiences, such as but not limited to arts and STEM camps and educational travel opportunities.
- The Sullivan Family Enrichment Scholarship was established by the family and friends of Thomas B. Sullivan. Mr. Sullivan was a long-time Boy Scout leader and an exceptional friend of the youth. This scholarship is available to Marshall area students to provide additional financial assistance to encourage students to participate in enrichment programs, such as, but not limited to, Philmont National, Boy Scout and Girl Scout camps, Interlochen music camp, educationally related national or international travel, Close-Up programs, school choir and FFA enrichment programs.
